 20 bumblebees and 77 solitary bees
- A honeybee needs to visit 2 million flowers to make a pound of honey in the hive
- Bumblebees make their nests in small holes in the ground, which is why hedges and dry stone walls are so important
- Pollinators are under serious pressure at the moment, for many different reasons
- Over 30% of the food we eat is pollinated by insects

What can we do to help Pollinator numbers increase locally?

- **G**row plants that attract and feed pollinators in your own garden, school or community spaces
- Change how you mow the lawn- set the blades higher and allow for some wild areas to grow, where you mow after the flowers have gone to seed
